### *Laura Dean Keeps Breaking Up With Me* (graphic novel) by Mariko Tamaki, illust. by Rosemary Valero-O'Connell

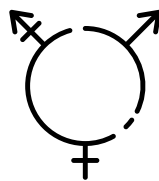
